Phase 1 – Engagement

- Establish current situation
- Describe the "ideal world"
- Report on key findings and identify activities

Phase 2 – Delivery of activities

- Deliver activities
- Evaluate



Observations to date

- Processors are interested in extending R&D if it supports commercial outcomes
- Processors participate in the development phase of R&D
- Processors see a competitive advantage in how they do extension
